SANTA MARIA WISDOM CENTER: New Alzheimer's Program

The development of our Alzheimer's Program occurred as a response to the need for specialized programming for participants diagnosed with Alzheimer's Disease. We have found that a generalized social and recreational activities program does not appropriately address the needs of these participants. This is why the LSF SMWC staff has been trained in two programs, Music & Memories and the Alzheimer's Association, Memories in the Making Art Program.

The Santa Maria Wisdom Center is now a Music and Memory certified facility. Grounded in extensive neuroscience research about how our brains respond to music, the program has helped thousands of residents, clients, patients, and the staff who care for them. Musical memory is profoundly linked to emotions. These memories are stored deep in the brain. While Alzheimer's damages the ability to recall facts and details, it does not destroy these lasting connections

LSF CENTRAL CALIFORNIA ADULT SERVICES: Overview

The Central California Adult Services is a Life Steps Foundation Affiliate providing both in-home supportive living services and independent living skills for adults with physical and developmental disabilities.
