#### **Grand Donation to LSF SoCal Adult Services**

On September 25, Life Steps Foundation SoCal Adult Services was fortunate to receive a generous donation of \$20,000 from the Greater Los Angeles New Car Dealers Association (GLANCDA). Association member Ian Thomas of Thomas Acura chose Life Steps to receive the gift. The Seaside Learning Center sent

Also, because of the escalating rental market in Long Beach, we provide rental assistance in the form of deposits and first month rent to clients without resources when they are in danger of becoming homeless. Additionally, we plan to make upgrades to the kitchen in the Seaside Learning Center and will buy emergency groceries for hungry individuals.

### LSF Santa Maria Wisdom Center: Caregiver Initiatives Held at the SMWC

aregivers are lifelines to their ✓loved ones with dementia and/ or various health concerns. Realizing the important part they play in the lives of our participants and others in the community, LSF SMWC became involved in a very important collaborative with our local general hospital, Dignity Health/ Marian Regional Medical Center. It involves hosting a twice monthly Caregiver Support Group at SMWC with our Medical Social Worker acting as the facilitator. Attendees are given a forum in which to discuss their issues/ concerns related to caregiving with others experiencing the same stress and pressures encountered in this 24/7 endeavor. The support group stresses self-care and resources for

caregivers as well. We also offer respite care for the caregivers' loved ones during the meeting for their convenience.

Additionally, we host a monthly Alzheimer's Association educational topics workshop at SMWC. The instructor is a volunteer from the Alzheimer's Association and offers such thought provoking topics as "Know the 10 Signs, Early Detection Matters."Theseinteractiveworkshops provide much needed knowledge for Caregivers and other members of the community regarding memory loss and dementia, including Alzheimer's. Knowledge is power when dealing with these issues that may be affecting individuals themselves or their loved ones.

ost of the kids have difficulty sitting for 30 minutes and paying attention during circle time when they first come to Wee Play in San Gabriel, CA. To help our participants through it, visual and audio materials are utilized and presented daily. With the help of teachers who sit behind them, they eventually gain focus and are able to participate in simple activities such as matching, identification and awareness of each other. Getting the

children constantly involved in taking turns, sharing and pretend playing are important and natural approaches to learning, while a multi-sensory approach makes them overcome many obstacles.

Wee Play is a structured program designed to help children with self-regulation in order to prepare them for preschool introduction. At Wee Play, we never underestimate the capacity of any child to learn.
