Life Steps and Community Arts Preschool Share Inclusion Success

On May 11th, Life Steps Children and Family Services in Northern California partnered with the Community Arts Preschool (CAP) to present the workshop Creating a Community That Supports All Learners at the 25th Annual Early Learning Conference presented by CoCo Kids.

A highlight of the event was Mariana Salas, whose child received services through Life Steps. She shared the story of her daughter's early medical challenges, and how home visits and the full inclusion program at CAP supported their child's development. The audience was touched by her honesty and spirit.

Julie Tadena, a Lead Teacher at CAP, discussed strategies that support inclusion and how to talk with parents about their child's development. Maile Ogasawara, Program Manager from CAP, talked about the City of Walnut Creek Arts+Rec Department's commitment to inclusion and their support of the partnership with Life Steps. We appreciated this opportunity to discuss the benefits of inclusion with child care providers and early education teachers from Contra Costa County. As we enter into the third year of our partnership with CAP, we look forward to expanding the number of children we support in the preschool classroom, and sharing our experiences with others in our community who also want to provide full inclusion opportunities.

Malabama and is the 10th child out of 14 in her family. Mary was 19 years old when she fell in love and married Richard Welch with whom she had two children. In 1969, Mary moved to San Francisco, California and started working all sort of jobs from a Sewing Technician to being a Bus Driver at Paratransit serving developmentally disabled individuals. Mary learned about Life Steps Foundation's Social Dynamics Day Program working at Paratransit. In April 2002, while Mary was dropping-off participants at the Social Dynamics Day Program, she learned Life Steps was hiring Class B Drivers, so she took her chance and applied for the position. Two weeks later, Mary was employed and became a Class B Driver and Educator for the Social Dynamics Day Program.

That was 17 plus years ago, today Mary still happily works as a parttime Educator. At Social Dynamics, Mary's talent on art work earned her annual awards such as *Best in Cubicle Decoration, Haunted House Making Contest* and the *Christmas Lantern Making Contest* to name a few. When asked how she lasted in working at Social Dynamics she answered, "Life Steps has brought joy and happiness in my life. Taking care and interacting with participants and the fulfillment feeling I get from meeting the needs of intellectually disabled people is priceless."

Mary is now enjoying life to the fullest playing with her three grandchildren. When asked until when does she see herself working here at Life Steps, she just bursted into laughter and said: "Forever!"
