# A Message from our Chief Executive Officer and Board President

During fiscal year 2018-2019, Life Steps Foundation was delighted to host the grand opening of the new Santa Maria Wisdom Center senior day health care facility. The opening of the Wisdom Center marked the beginning of a series of organization-wide accomplishments and enhancements. Life Steps leadership identified and implemented the following initiatives to strengthen the ability of our organization to meet mission objectives and refine program delivery: Expand community outreach and explore potential partnerships with other nonprofits and community organizations, focus on team building and effective communication between staff, grow the success of fundraising events and individual donor campaigns, continue to diversify revenue by securing support from foundations and corporations, and strengthen our board.

We are collaborating with preschools and school districts to expand inclusion preschool programs in California. One example is in Northern California where Life Steps is working with Community Arts Preschool in Walnut Creek. Life Steps is also partnering with organizations like Meals on Wheels in Southern California to bolster its connection with the community. Our SoCal Adult Services program location is assisting Meals on Wheels to deliver food to those in need. Staff members at this Life Steps location also participate alongside the adults they serve in the local Long Beach Marathon as a way to engage the adults they serve in the community and to connect Life Steps as an organization with the community. Additionally, this event is an opportunity for team building amongst the staff and individuals with developmental disabilities served.

As we work to increase the success of Life Steps' benefit events to secure community support, our program locations in proximity to each other are coming together to host exhilarating community gatherings and recreational events such as the popular Lobster Feed banquet dinner and the annual Fun Run in the Northern California Bay Area. Our organization has also had success garnering grants from foundations and corporations that had not previously supported Life Steps. This has made it possible for us to open the new Santa Maria Wisdom Center and to carry out important updates to the technological infrastructure of our organization. Life Steps is deeply grateful for contributions and support received from generous individuals, foundations, corporations, and government agencies.

It was also during fiscal year 2018-2019 that Eugene Boykins became the new Board President. His familiarity with Life Steps Foundation as a longtime member of the Board and his marketing and business expertise are a great asset to our organization. We recognize there is an opportunity to strengthen the Life Steps Board by adding new members with experience in professional capacities that will complement the knowledge base of current members. # **About Life Steps Foundation**

### **Mission**

Life Steps Foundation is a fiscally responsible, culturally competent California 501(c)(3) nonprofit dedicated to meeting the health, psychological and socioeconomic challenges of people throughout their lifespan who are experiencing mental, developmental or physical disabilities.

### **History and Goals**

Life Step's Foundation (LSF) began in the South Bay of Los Angeles County providing children's services in 1983 as a partnership between three mental health professionals who identified the need for in-home educational and preventive interventions as an alternative to costly institutionalization. Today, LSF is a statewide nonprofit with an annual budget of more than \$10 million serving a monthly average of 1,200 individuals across the life spectrum. Our core tenets are integrity, social responsibility, diversity, equity, teamwork and collaboration, creativity, innovation and transparency. Life Steps' Board of Directors and staff are over 70 percent minority represented.

Life Steps Foundation assists people with developmental disabilities to acquire confidence, training and social and emotional support needed to overcome obstacles related to their disability. At times, all of us need help taking the more challenging steps in life. When someone is living with a mental, developmental or physical disability, navigating through even the most basic challenges of daily life can be overwhelming. The individuals we serve enjoy an increased quality of life and thrive as vital members of their communities through their experience at Life Steps.

In alignment with its mission, Life Steps Foundation's primary goals are to: 1) Help children and adults achieve their full potential, 2) Empower people with development disabilities and elderly at risk of institutionalization to live independently, 3) Inspire and equip program participants with the necessary skills to become responsible, self-sufficient individuals able to function productively in their homes and communities and 4) Serve as an information resource for assisting people with developmental disabilities and senior citizens.

### **Programs and Services**

- Children and Family Services In-home early intervention and inclusion preschools, and parent training.
- Adult Services In-home support and center-based activities.
- Senior Care In-home assistance and center-based adult day health care.

### Awards and Recognition

Life Steps Foundation is well-established throughout California and respected for its commitment to best practices, quality services, empowerment of the individuals it serves and focus on prevention. Over the years, Life Steps has been recognized several times for its work by the United States Senate, California State Senate, California State Assembly and City of Los Angeles among other government entities.

### **Participant Story**

Neah had feeding difficulties requiring an NG tube soon after birth and was diagnosed with hypotonia and global developmental delay. She was listless and not interactive as months went by. Her parents were worried and overwhelmed. They started receiving weekly early intervention services from Neeti of Life Steps when Neah was 5 months old.

Neeti was very professional, knowledgeable, and caring. She provided Neah's parents with recommendations and the support needed to help Neah grow, develop, and meet her milestones. Neeti was like the baby whisperer during each hour-long, weekly session. I Neah began to surprise her parents each week with a with a new ability. Neeti empowered Neah's parents with strategies and tips to

practice and play with Neah until her next visit.

### Program

LSF CAFS, with services throughout the state of California, meets the needs of our youngest community members. Youngsters from birth to four years old who have or are at risk of developmental delays and have a diagnosis of developmental disabilities learn through in-home and centerbased (alongside children without disabilities) early intervention programs. These specialized programs support the youngster and maximize their development while helping parents foster their child's full potential. Through play and fun activities that attract the child's interest, our young participants learn many skills including how to socialize, make changes from one activity to another, develop attention skills, use language and cope with emotional challenges.

### **Participant Story**

Judy L. came to Life Steps Foundation SoCal Adult Services more than twenty years ago from a group home agency. The agency was having problems with Judy and really did not know how to handle the situation. When Judy came into our world, she was violent and did not know key skills to live on her own. Judy's first couple of years with Life Steps were difficult and she would sometimes become frustrated. One example is when she sat down in the middle of the bank and refused to leave. This caused quite a disturbance. She had trouble getting along at the grocery store with shoppers and staff. Dinner at first was quite an ordeal, because Judy would put her face in her plate and eat everything as fast as she could. She was used to behaving this way to protect her food in the institutions and group homes where she once lived. One day Judy all of a sudden slowly started to come around. She would no longer sit on the bank floor or fight with customers at the super market. Seeing Judy now, it is hard to believe she is the same person from more than 20 years ago. Not only can she manage her home, but six years ago she voted for the first time and knew exactly who she wanted elected. All of us here at Life Steps Foundation SoCal Adult Services are proud of Judy and everything she has accomplished.

## Program

LSF SoCal Adult Services is headquartered in Long Beach, California and serves a monthly average of more than 300 adults throughout Greater Los Angeles and Orange County. Most participants have an intellectual disability; others are living with cerebral palsy, epilepsy, autism, or other physical, emotional or mental issues. We help these adults maximize their independence and maintain their desired quality of life. Participants learn critical skills and have the opportunity to socialize through a variety of highquality and proven programs, training and center-based activities. Ours is a collaborative effort between the program participant and Life Steps instructor as the participant learns to be autonomous, develops a circle of friends and other people who can support their goals and becomes a positive contributor to his or her community.

# Participant Story

Ray is determined to remain as independent as possible. He lives in his own apartment close to downtown where all the action is, and uses his power wheelchair to get around. He enjoys taking public transportation to and from his work program, to community activities, and to attend church on Sundays. Life Steps assists Ray with tracking deadlines, personal hygiene needs, toileting and transferring in and out of bed to his wheelchair. He loves to search for recipes and gets assistance from his staff to prepare meals for himself. One of Ray's main goals is to be able to learn to cook with minimal assistance from Life Steps staff.

### **Participant Story**

Born in Orange County, California on May 24, 1925, Arnulfo was one of eight children and the youngest of the five boys. Drafted into the Army in his early 20's during WWII, he did basic training in Mineral Wells, Texas and served during the occupation in Europe. Arnie then did a short stint in Korea. After the war, he returned home and met his lovely wife, Anna. They married in 1950 and had three sons and a daughter. Arnie has always been known for his strong work ethic and devotion to his family. He has worked as a baker, owned a trucking company, and then became a driver for the Knudsen Creamery Company where he worked for 25 years. He was assigned to the Santa Maria-to-Fresno route and received many awards for time efficiency. Arnie and his wife recently celebrated their 70th wedding anniversary, and they also recently celebrated Arnie's 95th birthday. They have spent their retirement traveling to places like Mexico, Spain, Portugal, Israel, and Rome - where they were able to be a part of a private mass with Pope Benedict. Arnie has always been a true patriot and loves his country. He passed a respect for our military and service to our country down to his children and grandchildren. He has a son who served in the Marines, a grandson serving in the Air Force, and a great grandson serving in the Navy. Another grandson served in the Army and tragically lost his life during his second tour of duty in Afghanistan, a true hero.

## Program

LSF Santa Maria Wisdom Center, based in Santa Maria, California, is the only licensed Adult Day Health Care and Community Based Adult Services (CBAS) program in the counties of Santa Barbara and San Luis Obispo. For elderly and disabled adults who require medical monitoring, our comprehensive day health care program enhances their quality of life. Wisdom Center programs and services are designed to prevent delay or reduce premature institutionalization and help our participants remain in their natural, supportive living environments for as long as possible. The Center provides loving family caregivers with much needed, quality elder care assistance. Our programs and services include door-to-door transportation, nursing and medication monitoring, rehabilitative therapies and stimulating social and recreational therapies. Additionally, the Center offers interested seniors a nutritious dinner Monday through Friday delivered to their doorstep at a cost of \$5.50 per meal.

## **Participant Story**

Stephanie's outgoing personality and vibrant energy has been such a joy to work with since joining Life Steps Northern California Adult Services in 2016. Every morning when she arrives to Social Dynamics, she greets her peers and staff with a smile and "Hello!". She begins her day with morning Zumba along with her peers for half an hour. Stephanie communicates using a Picture Exchange Communication System (PECS) for all of her wants and needs while at the day program. She enjoys putting together complicated puzzles and shredding old files. She also enjoys going out into the community to shop at the local Trader Joe's with her educator to pick up healthy snacks. Although Stephanie does require close supervision, she continues to show improvement and does it all with a smile on her face.

## Program

LSF NCAS Social Dynamics is a center-based day program for developmentally disabled adults with behavioral challenges. Our participants require assistance and supervision. At the Center, they receive intervention, education and training in a low pressure environment that is rich in positive reinforcement. Our programs and services are designed to empower these men and women to advocate for themselves, participate in their community and maximize their potential. Through interaction with our professional and highly trained staff, our program participants learn important tools such as how to communicate their needs more effectively, methods to integrate into their community and mobility training so they can move safely around their environment.





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# Life Steps Foundation Leadership

## Main Office

Life Steps Foundation's headquarters houses administrative departments that provide executive leadership, accounting, payroll, human resources, development and community relations, training and quality management and information technology services for our sites across the southern, central coast and northern regions of California. Our centralized model for administrative services increases staffing and fiscal efficiency. It also enhances group cohesion and consistency of high quality program delivery across all sites.

The Life Steps Foundation budget for fiscal year 2019 was approximately \$11 million. Thanks to the prudent financial planning of our executive leadership, LSF maintains a robust ratio of assets to liabilities that is approximately 10:1 to ensure fiscal stability as a hedge against unforeseen economic circumstances. We continue to focus efforts on increasing the diversity of our revenue streams to mitigate unanticipated shortfalls from any one income source. Growing support from foundation, corporate and individual donors is key to the success of our revenue diversification initiative. Life Steps' leadership also recognizes the importance of planned giving and is working diligently to identify and cultivate opportunities for legacy gifts.
